

<u>A PILGRIMAGE AND INVITATION TO PRAYER</u> Article by Claire McGrath

Over the past weekend, I went on a 30 mile pilgrimage with my brother Martin and some friends from Quincy University. We walked from the site of Venerable Fr. Augustus Tolton's baptism (St. Peter's Church, Brush Creek, MO) to his tomb (St. Peter's Cemetery, Quincy, IL).



When I started the pilgrimage, I knew very little about Fr. Tolton, but I have since tried to learn as much as I can about him. Fr. Tolton was the first African American from the USA who was ordained as a priest. He was born a slave on April 1, 1854, and became a free person when his mom escaped to Quincy, IL, with him and his sister in 1863. After years of work and study, he was ordained a priest in Rome on April 24, 1886. Fr. Tolton spent his priesthood serving the poor and all who came to him for help in Quincy and Chicago until he died of heat stroke in Chicago on July 9, 1897.

While on this amazing pilgrimage, I offered my joys, sufferings, and prayers for the healing one of our parishioners. He was recently diagnosed with ALS (also known as Lou Gehrig's Disease), and he and his family have been suffering greatly.

Fr. Tolton has not yet been declared a Saint, but his cause is up for canonization. He is currently a Venerable, though, which is the step before being declared Blessed.

God can and wants to heal us. While that healing may not always be what we imagine it should be, His healing is exactly what we need. God also provides us with many intercessors in Heaven who want to pray for all of us who are still on Earth. Fr. Tolton has not yet been declared a Saint, but we can still ask him to pray for us and our loved ones.

This Sunday, April 21, 2024, I am going to begin a novena to Venerable Fr. Augustus Tolton for the healing of our parishioner. I would like to invite each member of our parish to join me in this novena, not formally at a specific time each day, but whenever you can each day from April 21 to April 29.

VENERABLE AUGUSTINE TOLTON NOVENA PRAYER O God, we give You thanks for Your servant and priest, Father Augustus Tolton, who labored among us in times of contradiction, times that were both beautiful and paradoxical. His ministry helped lay the foundation for a

paradoxical. His ministry helped lay the foundation for a truly Catholic gathering in faith in our time. We stand in the shadow of his ministry. May his life continue to inspire us and imbue us with that confidence and hope that will forge a new evangelization for the Church we love.

Father is Heaven, Father Tolton's suffering service sheds light upon our sorrows; we see them through the prism of Your Son's passion and death. If it be Your Will, O God, glorify Your servant, Father Tolton, by granting the favor I now request through his intercession (mention your request "for the healing of Scott Crye") so that all may know the goodness of this priest whose memory looms large in the Church he loved.

Complete what You have begun in us that we might work for the fulfillment of Your kingdom. Not to us the glory, but glory to You O God, through Jesus Christ, Your Son and our Lord; Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, You are our God, living and reigning forever and ever. Amen.
